



He then fits a wedge under the belt to tighten it. The results: a great sanding block with a flat surface. You can make several and have different grits of sanding papers.

Close up of the textured ring.




Sid Bright made this segmented pendant. He used Olive Wood, Black Walnut and Maple. He used Poly to finish the pendant.



John Sackuvich brought in this interesting bowl. Remember my perfect storm; no notes. The only information about this bowl on John's card is "BOM?" "B,IDK".


**Boy, I Don't Know!**

Notice, the front and back of the cutting board in the top two pictures.




## Break Time

## Bowl Exchange






